

Duhallow Choral Society was founded in 1996 to promote music and culture in the Duhallow region. The choir currently has 70 members and has toured in Belgium, USA, Germany and Italy.

Ceoltóirí Sliabh Luachra are a group of talented musicians, singers and dancers who have been trained at *Bruach na Carraige*, Rockchapel since 2010.

The Pards are a military re-enactment group that has performed at Spike Island, Charles Fort and other historic venues during their illustrious career.

Diarmuid O'Flynn is the founder of the "*Ballyhea Says No*" campaign, and in 2014 began working as one of MEP Luke "*Ming*" Flanagan's parliamentary assistants. He was the *Irish Examiner's* chief hurling correspondent until his relocation to Brussels in 2014.

The Lorraine O'Riordan Gospel Choir has been entertaining audiences throughout Duhallow for many years with their superb vocal harmonies.

Cornelius Patrick O' Sullivan is a comedian, a poet and a mentalist. His unique style fuses anecdotal comedy with poetry, bizarre impressions and quirky one line observations.

Fear na Coillte, Will Fogarty, gives demonstrations in the art of Chainsaw Sculptures. His work is unique, involving breath-taking craftsmanship.

Cian O'Sullivan is an artist and art educator based in Mallow, Co. Cork. He has worked with the Cope Foundation, Alzheimer's Society of Ireland and Kaleidoscope Drama Group. His current work is based in both traditional portraiture and more abstracted work based on the human head.

Mary Bradford is a North Cork novelist and playwright. She has enjoyed many successes with her short stories and books. She is at present working on the sequel to her novel, *My Husband's Sin* and on a short film script.

Around The Farm Gate is a unique collection of 50 stories written by different authors (including two from Kanturk) detailing their experiences of the rural Ireland in which they grew up.

"A Night Of Drama" features short plays from Mary England, Jacqui Feely, Mike Guerin, Ann Leo O'Connor, Marie O'Halloran and Aidan O' Keeffe.

The Scoil Mhuire Traditional Ensemble, made up of pupils from the local secondary school, will be performing a ten minute set of Irish music including some wonderful sean nós singing.

Mallow Camera Club was set up in 1986 and has been successful in a number of regional, national and international competitions. The club meets every Monday night, except bank holidays, in the Mercy Centre, Fair Street, Mallow at 8pm. No need to book for this workshop. Just turn up with your camera or even your iPhone!

The Clon Jazz Collective has a monthly Sunday afternoon jazz session in De Barra's, Clonakilty. They play songs by Miles Davis and Duke Ellington, along with some bossa nova numbers, and even some funk!
